American Legion Multiyear Membership is Here

Eliminate the yearly hassle of remembering to renew your American Legion membership by taking advantage of the new multiyear membership available to current and potential members. Legionnaires needing to renew for 2024 or veterans joining the organization for the first time can lock-in a three-year membership by visiting legion.org/renew

A multiyear membership was approved by the National Executive Committee of The American Legion during the organization's Spring Meetings last May. Resolution 1: Purchase of Multiple Years of Membership approves "a five-year pilot program offering the purchase of three consecutive 12-month member terms at the then current dues rate."

Here is what you need to know about the three-year membership:

. .

- Multiyear membership sign-up is only available on the national American Legion website. Current or potential members cannot renew or join for a three-year membership at the post level or through MyLegion.org.
- Renew now with a three-year membership by visiting <u>legion.org/renew</u>.
- Join now with a three-year membership by visiting <u>legion.org/join</u>.
- Legionnaires already renewed for 2024 will soon be able to renew under the multi-year membership starting with the 2025 membership year.
- Payment for the three-year membership will be upfront.
- There is no discount rate with the three-year membership.
- Membership cards will still be sent annually by Legion posts.

Please note that the multiyear membership will work just like PUFL. Whatever rate at which the member renews is the rate which the post/department/national will receive for the duration of that timeframe. For example, if a member renews today (before national per-capita \$5 dues increase come July 1, 2024), National will receive \$18.50 for the next three years. Let's say the department's per capita is currently \$10 and is going to raise to \$15 come July 1, 2024. The department will receive the \$10 for the next three years. Once the member renews after the three year renewal is up, the renewal rate will adjust to the rate at that time.

MCJROTC Championship By Mike Flanagan

Marisa McDonough and Elizabeth Gunn are long standing Post 290 Junior Shooters, they are also firing members of the Mountain View High school Marine Corps JROTC team.

Mountain View made it to the all MCJROTC Championship this year with a 4-adet team consisting of Marisa Elizabeth, Sameer Singh (prior 290 Jr Shooter) and Charles Wallace. They fired in Sandy, Utah, February 8-10.

The team finished in 6th place advancing to the All JROTC Championship that will be held in Camp Perry Ohio later in March of this year.

This team was carried into victory by Marisa who finished in 3rd place overall with 1,191 out of 1,300 points possible and Elizabeth finishing with 1,066 out of 1,200.

One of the exciting portions of this Championship is at the end where they take the top 8 shooters and have them do a "Shoot Out". During this Shoot Out, the 8 shooters line up and

take one shot at a time from the standing position, during a 1-minute time period. They do this for 10 shots. While they are firing, the remaining 90 competitors and Coaches are watching and cheering them on.

During this high stress shooting environment, the 8 competitors have the opportunity to increase or decrease their overall position. Marisa entered the Shoot Out in 4th position and after placing 1st (94.1 out of 100) in the Shoot Out, she came out taking the 3rd place overall, receiving the bronze medal. Marisa definitely has nerves of steel when it comes to firing in competitions

This is a perfect example of how our Post 290 Jr Shooters program is instilling important life skills in our young athletes; not just marksmanship but dealing with life pressures, perseverance, resiliency, teamwork, as well as attention to detail. At the same time, we are helping Stafford County High School JROTCs go where they have not been before.

NOMINATIONS FOR ELECTION OF OFFICERS IN MAY 2024 BY MIKE SCULLIN, ADJUTANT

Fellow Legionnaires,

It's that time already for Post 290's Nomination Committee to start putting together a slate of nominations for Post Officer positions to serve the 2024-2025 term. If you have the time, inclination or interest in serving as a Post Officer, I encourage you to submit a nomination or nominations.

Any Post Member in good standing is eligible and encouraged to submit his/her nomination for ANY position, even if an incumbent has expressed an interest in continuing to serve in that position.

Once submitted, the nominations will be added to the 2024-2025 Officers slate, which will be presented to the General Membership at Post 290's April 2024 General Membership meeting. The General Membership will then vote on nominees at the May 2024 General Membership meeting with Officer installations to occur in June 2024. The term of service for Post Officers is June 2024 – June 2025. Two Executive Committee Members' three-year terms will be completed in June 2024, so if elected to one of the Executive Committee Member positions, those terms will end in June 2027.

COMMANDER: It shall be the duty of the Post Commander to preside over all meetings of the Post and to have general supervision over the business and affairs of the Post, and such officer shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Post. The Post Commander shall approve all orders directing the disbursement of funds and shall make an annual report covering the business of the Post for the year, and recommendations for the ensuing year, which shall be read at the annual meeting and a copy thereof immediately forwarded to the Department Adjutant. The Post Commander is an ex-officio member of all committees.

1st VICE COMMANDER: The 1st Vice Commander shall assist and discharge the duties of the office of Commander in the absence or disability of the Commander, or when called upon, by the Post Commander. The 1st Vice Commander is responsible for Post membership and shall also render annual reports on membership, or when call upon at a meeting. The 1st Vice Commander is the Chairman of the Post's Membership Committee.

2nd VICE COMMANDER: The 2nd Vice Commander shall assist and discharge the duties of the office of Commander in the absence or disability of the Commander and 1st Vice Commander, or when called upon, by the Post Commander. The 2nd Vice Commander is responsible for oversight of contracted personnel for cleaning of and repairs on Post facilities, as well as scheduling the use of Post facilities and handling rentals of the Post Annex. Please note that the 2nd Vice Commander will NOT be required to perform custodial duties, as these services will be contracted out by the Post 290 Executive Committee. The 2nd Vice Commander is the Chairman of the Post's House Committee.

Duties (continued)

3rd VICE COMMANDER: The 3rd Vice Commander shall assist and discharge the duties of the office of Commander in the absence or disability of the Commander, 1st Vice Commander and 2nd Vice Commander or when called upon, by the Post Commander. The 3rd Vice Commander is Chairman of the Post's Ways and Means Committee – responsible for conducting periodic and regular money making activities conforming to Post policies, all special money making functions sponsored by the Post, and recommendations to the Post Membership forways and means of accomplishing the two previously-mentioned activities. The 3rd Vice Commander is also Chairman of the Post's Entertainment Committee – charged with the arrangement of social activities, the promotion of Post advantages and the entertainment for Post meetings, such as speakers, music, refreshments, etc.

ADJUTANT: The Post Adjutant shall have charge of and keep a full and correct record of all proceedings of the Post, keep such records as the Department and National organizations may require, and under direction of the Commander handle all correspondence of the Post. The Post Adjutant is an ex-officio member of all committees.

FINANCE OFFICER: The Finance Officer of the Post shall have charge of all finances and see that they are safely deposited in some local bank or banks and shall report to the Post Membership the conditions of the finances for the Post, with such recommendations as he/she may deem expedient or necessary for raising funds with which to carry on the activities of the Post. The Finance Officer shall be bonded in such sum as shall, be fixed by the Post Membership and shall be the Chairman of the Finance Committee. He/she shall keep records of all receipts and expenditures with supporting vouchers, using the suggested forms of National Headquarters, The American Legion.

SERVICE OFFICER: The Service Officer shall disseminate such information and instruction as may be helpful in dealing with affairs of disabled veterans, matters concerning the administration of the Depart of Veterans Affairs or Adjusted Compensation Law, claims of ex-servicemen against the United States Government.

CHAPLAIN: The Chaplain shall be charged with maintaining the spiritual welfare of the Post comrades and will offer divine but non-sectarian service in the event of dedications, funerals, etc., adhere to such ceremonial rituals as are recommended by the National or Department Headquarters from time to time.

JUDGE ADVOCATE: The Judge Advocate's duties shall be to advice the Post Commander of the interpretation or modification of the Post's Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules and Regulations, and be responsible for an annual financial audit and the Post Responsibility Audit as described in the American Legion Officer's Guide.

POST HISTORIAN: The Post Historian shall consolidate the reports call memorial exercises held during his term of office. The Post Historian shall be custodian of such books, manuscripts, pamphlets, and like possessions relating to the Wars belonging to the Post. The Post Historian shall be charged with maintaining individual records and incidents of the Post and duties as may properly pertain to the office as may be determined by the Post Executive Committee.

POST PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICER: shall be responsible for advancing the visibility of Post 290's programs and activities with all available media (print, social, and radio). Post Public Relations will establish rapport with the local newspapers, radio stations, and work with the webmaster and other social media sources. Post Public Relations will provide articles and photos for publication and dissemination of Post programs and activities.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: The Sergeant-at-Arms shall receive all visitors, take their names, Post Numbers, and purpose of their visit, and pass this information on to the Adjutant for introduction to the membership. The Sergeant-at-Arms shall escort all distinguished guests to the Commander immediately, and may challenge any member for good standing whenever he/she sees fit to do so and shall preserve order at all meetings. The Sergeant-at-Aims shall ensure that the color bearers place the colors in their proper place during the Post meetings, and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Post Commander.

Duties (continued)

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEMBER: The Post Executive Committee shall have general supervision of the Post's affairs between General Post Membership meetings. The Post Executive Committee shall make recommendations to the General Post Membership and perform such other duties as are specified in the Post's Bylaws.

In conclusion, American Legion Post 290's leadership encourages all members to become actively involved in our Post. Everyone is encouraged to submit a nomination for any and all positions that might interest them.
