Legionnaires, by the time you read this, there will only be a couple of months left in 2025. Can you believe it? How time flies. It sure seems to go faster the older I get, but I digress. If you have not yet renewed your membership for 2026, I ask you to do so as soon as possible. If you have already renewed, thank you very much!

Here are some membership stats as of 4 September

- The Department of Virginia is a 56.80%
- District 16 (the district that 290 is in) is at 59.17% (3rd overall in the Department)
- Post 290 is a 57.45% of the goal Department has set
- Post 290 renewals are at 55.42%. I really think we can do better than that.

There are a number of ways to renew your membership. You can mail it in to the Post, but you can save yourself the cost of a stamp (can you believe how much they cost now?); by dropping it off at the Post and ask someone to put it in my inbox, or you can renew online at mylegion.org. If you renew online, you don't need to let me know. I check online renewals often. If you would like to renew for more than a single year, you can only do that online. I am unable to process multi-year renewals. Also, if you would like to become a Paid Up For Life (PUFL) member, that can only be done online as well.

If you have renewed your membership (or recently transferred to 290) and have not received your new membership card, please let me know and I will look into it. If you have lost your card and need a replacement, I can do that for you as well. You can email me at Post290.1ST. Vice. CDR@gmail.com.

Happy Fall Post 290!

On August 15 -21, 2025, seven members of the American Legion Riders (ALR) – 290 (Marty and Juanita Partridge; Denver and Derice Steele, Justin and Tori Goemmer, and Don Dillon with Laura Werner (ALR-1976) participated in the Virginia Fun Run "Ride to the Ride" and the National Legacy Run. Springfield Post 176 hosted the start of the Fun Run and graciously provided dinner on Friday, August 15th and breakfast on Saturday, August 16th prior to heading out. The Fun Run started at 8:00am on Saturday and was a one-day ride to American Legion Post 8, South Boston, VA to meet up with Riders from across the country for the start on the National Legacy Run. Virginia Riders showed up in great numbers and demonstrated their Legacy Run support.

The National Legacy Run started on Sunday, August 17th at Post 8, and took us to Fayetteville, NC on day-1; Myrtle Beach, SC on day-2; Beaufort, SC on day-3; Jacksonville, FL on day-4; and ended in Tampa, FL on day-5. There were over 300 Bikes, and 400 participants/support personnel to manage the ride. All in all, it was a great time. On day-3, our group of eight did our own ride, which gave us a later start and time to enjoy Myrtle Beach, before heading to Beaufort, SC to meet up with the large group in the late afternoon. What a great day that turned out to be. In total our group accumulated 1,488 miles on the ride. However, we took the Amtrak Auto-Train from Sanford, FL to Lorton, VA for the return trip – and it was worth it.

The National Legacy Run was a huge success in raising funds for The American Legion Veterans and Children's Foundation. Virginia donated a total of \$72,000 on the ride, and retained \$34,000 for Veterans and Children's fund within the state of Virginia. A total of \$108,000 so far. In June during the Virginia Legacy Run, Post 290, ALR-290 and Unit 290 collectively donated \$8,500 in direct funds, plus the costs of registrations, raffles and T-shirts, exceeded \$10,000.

While not all were able to participate in the National Legacy Run, Riders here at home participated in the Marine Band of Brothers annual Poker Run in support of their Richmond McGuire VA Hospital support fund. Several ALR-290 members showed up and we donated \$250 in addition to registrations.

HOLIDAY FOOD BASKET PROGRAM

Tis the Season to Prepare for the Annual Holiday Food Basket Program

The Post 290 Holiday Food Basket (HFB) Program has evolved over the years, but the mission to support our community in need has remained the same. Furthermore, Post 290 continues to be a registered community sponsor of the Stafford County Department of Social Service's (DSS) Holiday Program, which provides Christmas (or Thanksgiving) assistance to families by matching businesses, churches, and community groups with those in need. DSS families who qualify are invited to register with the Stafford County DSS for food and gifts through this Holiday Program. As a community sponsor, Post 290 collaborates with DSS and is matched with approximately 100 or more of these local families to provide food assistance during the Christmas season.

Post 290 has supported the Stafford County community in need for more than 70 years and presently the HFB is the Post's largest community outreach project. Today's HFB Program focuses on providing food boxes of non-perishable fruits, vegetables, grains, and proteins to the local families in need. Post 290 also distributes a loaf of bread and a restricted gift card so that these families can choose either a ham or turkey and whichever produce is best for their particular situation.
